

# Adventure Recreation and Tourism



## Summary of Proposed Changes

### Goals:

- Alleviate “time crunch” in Expedition Skills I course
- Provide appropriate training for Conservation Law students
- Provide more opportunities to share courses with Con Law program
- Retain transfer fluidity to 4-year programs
- Eliminate incomplete grades issued in ADV140 Maine Environment
- Increase scope of technical training in ADV113 Ropes Course Facilitation
- Create new opportunities for students to satisfy science requirement
- Include new Search and Rescue certification training
- Implement physical fitness training into program

### Strategies:

- Split ADV140 The Maine Environment course into two new 1.5-credit courses
- Create new 1-credit Personal Fitness course that meets standards of MCJA and outdoor industry
- Create new 1-credit Search and Rescue certification course
- Embed navigation learning objectives into Expedition Skills courses
- Remove sailing expedition from ADV111 Expedition Skills I
- Remove 1-credit nav courses ADV130, 131, and 132 and repackage learning objectives into Expedition Skills and ADV210 Sailing courses
- Remove 1-credit ADV112 Intro to Sailing course and embed into existing 3-credit ADV210 Sailing course as elective for second-year students to cover sailing skills removed from ADV111 and ADV112
- Change ADV113 Ropes Course Facilitation from 1-credit to 2-credit course to include both low ropes and high ropes elements
- Change Biology requirement to any 4-credit lab science course
